


Game: Steal the treasure

Attacking Learning focus: intelligently dribbling with the ball Defending Learning focus: intelligent defending to win the ball back How to play

Children split into 4 teams. Each team seek to steal the ball from other teams and dribbling back to their own area. Players can steal the footballs from each other and can only steal one ball per player. Team with most footballs wins the game.

Decisions, challenges & questions within the game

- How would you hide the ball from the guard?
- Where would you dribble to keep the ball?
- Can you show me which foot would you use to make the guard difficult to take the ball away from you?
- When would you dribbling and when would you be shielding the ball?
- How intelligent defending looks like-the guard ability to win the ball and have the ball at the same time
- Individual challenges based on children needs and development

Game levels (progressions)-children can move to next level
Only when they feel ready and achieved success in previous level.

- Level 2: Each team have one guard to defend the area
- Level 3: Each team can have between 1-3 guards
- Level 4: Two SSG play simultaneously. To score team need to dribble the ball under control into opposite team area.

Child hide the ball to make difficult to take away
Child loves the ball and able to keep it against more than 1 guard

Child show ability to change direction and confused guard on more than one occasion Children can stop and start fluently

Children finding different ways to beat guards (solving problems)
Guard show determination to win the ball back cleanly
Children are creative with the ball
Children play rock paper scissors.
